




# Get to Know the Letter "A"

Decorate the uppercase and lowercase letters.




## Meet "Big A" also called "Uppercase A"

Trace the shape with your finger. Start with the number 1 and follow the lines.




## Meet "Little a" also called "Lowercase a"

Trace the shape with your finger. Start with the number 1 and follow the lines.




### Dot the Letter "A"


Color the circles, use a dab marker, cover the dots with pom poms or coins, or fill in the circles another way to build the uppercase (also called a capital) letter.



## Dot the Letter "a"

Color the circles, use a dab marker, cover the dots with pom poms or coins, or fill in the circles another way to build the lowercase letter.







### **Puzzle Practice**

Color the puzzle pieces, then cut them out.


Save them to continue practicing uppercase and lowercase letter matching.







### **Puzzle Practice**








Each of these items starts with the "a" sound. Say their names out loud! Color the items and hang up your picture. Practice the "a" sound.




## Eat the "A"s

Use your crayon or pencil to connect the "A"s and help Alfie the hungry alligator eat the "A"s to get to the apple.




## Color the way through "a"

## Trace the "Aa"


Use your pencil or crayon to trace both the uppercase "A" and the lowercase "a". Then trace and color the acorn.






## Trace the "Aa"


Use your pencil or crayon to trace both the uppercase "A" and the lowercase "a". Then trace and color the anteater.



## Trace the "Aa"


Use your pencil or crayon to trace both the uppercase "A" and the lowercase "a". Then trace and color the ambulance.






## Dab the Letters: "Aa"

Use a crayon, a dab marker, a pom pom, dried beans, or a coin to cover all the lowercase and uppercase "A"s and "a"s.




## Build the Big Letter "A"

Using dough or clay, shape the Uppercase "A" on the pattern. Then make your own "A" in the box. Be sure to practice making the "A" sound.




## **Build the Little Letter "a"**

Using dough or clay, make the design.




## Alligator begins with "A"

Using dough or clay, make the design.




## Anchor begins with "A"

Using dough or clay, make the design.




Anchors are usually in the sea. Can you make waves, too?




## Write the Letter "A"


## Fill in the Dots: Apple Juice

Use dot markers, dot circles, pom poms, crayons, thumbprints, dried beans, or anything else you have to fill in the dots and decorate the picture.




## Fill in the Dots: Anteater & Ants
